MONITOR CARE TIPS

Feeding - Feed monitors daily. They require a proper variety of food items. Dusting food with calcium and vitamin powders helps keep your lizard healthy. Take note if your monitor does not eat.

Water - The water dish should be checked, cleaned and refilled every day.

Heating and Temperature - Make sure you offer your monitor the proper heat gradient. Place a thermometer at each end of the enclosure to track

temperatures. Be sure your heating source works properly, and immediately replace if it does not.

Cleaning - Spot-cleaning the cage daily to remove any soiled spots, shed skin or uneaten food. Replace substrate every week, and tear down the terrarium for a full cleaning once a month.

Shedding - Keep handling to a minimum while a lizard is shedding. Misting the lizard lightly with a water bottle can help ease a difficult shed.

Defecation - Regular defecation is a sign of good health.

Health Check - Inspect your lizard daily to make sure that the eyes are clear, the lizard does not have a runny nose, there are no signs of breathing difficulty, the skin looks good, and there are no shedding problems.

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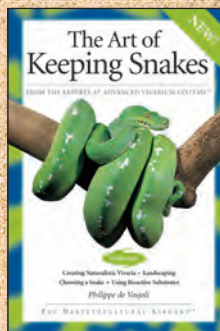
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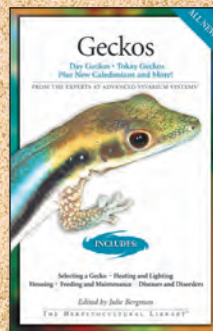
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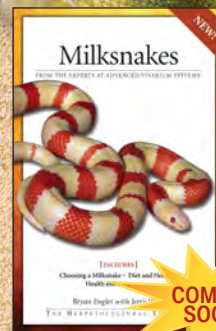
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
